**BACKGROUND:** During the Lakes Master Plan process, it was determined that the current fees associated with lake amenities available at Lake Lawtonka and Lake Ellsworth are below the market value for similar amenities in the region. At the City Council meeting held on November 14, 2023, Council directed staff to bring back a resolution increasing fees at the Lake Lawtonka recreational areas up to twenty-five percent with an effective date of January 1, 2024. The resolution includes fee increases for camper and trailer spaces within Schoolhouse Slough and increases for dry stalls, wet slips, and most boathouse at Lake Lawtonka.
