LAWTON POLICE DEPARTMENT 2022

- Total of 86,100 calls for service for 2022
- Most calls averaged two officers responding
- ☐ This led to approximately 172,200 police responses
- Different call types require varying responses Serious or violent crimes
- Critical/fatal traffic accidents, require our largest response of officers

CALLS FOR SERVICE: KEEP IN MIND

- Each call is taken seriously and the Lawton Police Department acts accordingly with policy each time.
- It is always possible these numbers can change, as many of the calls for service that initially start as a Burglary call, may end up being a different case altogether, which of course, may change response.
- Even with a limited number of personnel, the Average Response time for a Call for Service with the Lawton Police Department is 0:04:46 to 0:05:34.

It is important to remember that our officers also initiate self-generated activity and responses while on duty.

Which is not recorded in the numbers for calls for service.

- Detectives are responsible for the cases they are assigned to along with call outs. Call outs include, but are not limited to, homicides, shootings, and death investigations.








2019-2023 HOMICIDE NUMBERS

- A web-enabled application that ensures complaints, use of force, vehicle accidents and pursuits are entered, tracked and managed by supervisory staff
- High availability early intervention platform designed to provide supervisory and command critical information in real-time

- Funding that is received from the event helps pay out for felony tips that leads to an arrest
- Community event held at Elmer Thomas Park

- Allows the citizens to know that Crime Stoppers of Southwest Oklahoma is still serving in our community

Mock Prom Night Accident

- Coordinated with Lawton Public Schools to host a *mock* promight accident
